





Moon Lesson

What is the moon?

The moon is a big, round rock in the sky that we can see at night. It goes around the Earth and changes shapes like a circle, a half-circle, or a tinu sliver!



What is the moon made of?

The moon is made of rock and dust. It doesn't have trees. water, or people. It's kind of like a giant dusty ball in the sky.

What does the moon do?

The moon goes around the Earth and shines at night. It helps light up the sky when the sun goes down. The moon helps us understand what part of the month we are in by changing how much of it we can see at night.

Can we go to the moon?
Yes! Astronauts fly to the moon wearing special suits and ride in a big rocket ship that blasts off into the sky. The rocket flies all the way to the moon, and when it lands, the astronauts can walk on the moon with their space boots!



Moon Painting with Sponges
